Voluntary Microchip Assignment

Microchip Number

A microchip is an effective means of permanent identification. The rice-sized microchip is injected with a sterile needle, is reliable, virtually painless and can be registered nationally with the manufacturer. It is not a tracking device and can only be read with a microchip reader held close to the skin. We recommend the microchip, especially for pets that travel. We also recommend a collar tag with owner contact info for easy visual identification.
