| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Level 1 means BE READY for potential evacuation. There is a fire in your local area. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Level 2 means BE SET (ready) to evacuate. You must be ready & prepared to leave at a moment's notice! | <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Level 3 means GO, evacuate NOW. Leave immediately!</i></p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Know alternate ways out of your neighborhood. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prepare for family member(s) with special needs, mobile property (boats/trailers/ATV), and pets or livestock. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Level 2 signifies that there is significant danger in your area. Load your 6-P's and 7-day kit into your vehicle. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The danger in your area is current and you should evacuate immediately. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Remember: during an evacuation, roads become congested with vehicles, dust, and smoke which make an evacuation a slow process. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Monitor social media, news and radio for information. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Relocate to a specified shelter or with family/friends who are outside of the affected area (if notified by EM to do so) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> DO NOT delay leaving to gather any belongings or make efforts to protect your home. | |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Emergency Personnel may contact you via an emergency notification system. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You MAY have time to gather necessary items, however REMEMBER you must be prepared and ready to relocate. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Drive calmly and pay special attention to emergency vehicles. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keep your vehicle fuel tank at least half full. |
| <p>Before and During FIRE SEASON:</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you have time when leaving your home, write EVACUATED on a pillow case and hang it at the end of your driveway. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not block access to roadways for emergency vehicles or other evacuees. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> For up to date fire behavior information call: 907-347-6801 |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prepare an Alaska 7-day emergency kit: http://ready.alaska.gov/ | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do you have PROPANE TANKS? | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Designate an "out of area contact" who can relay information. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> At Level 2, this may be the ONLY advance notice you have to finish getting ready to EVACUATE. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check-in at an emergency shelter. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make a list of your 6 "P's". | <p style="color: red;">GO EARLY!</p> <p>Remember the 6-P's:</p> <p><u>P</u>eople, <u>P</u>ets, <u>P</u>ills, <u>P</u>hotos, <u>P</u>ersonal (computer backup info) and important <u>P</u>apers.</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take pets to a designated PET Evacuation Center | |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Create at least 30 feet of defensible space around your home. | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do NOT call 9-1-1 for "non-emergencies" | |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Know the evacuation plans for family members in assisted living and child care facilities. | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not attempt to re-enter the fire area until it is declared safe to do so. ** | |
